2 intro courses:

- 1 (190–199) “Confronting the Canon”

7 intermediate courses (200-level), including

- 1 Shakespeare (EGL 200 or 201)
- 1 Pre-1700 (EGL 202 – 215)
- 1 1700-1900 (EGL 216 – 236, 282)
- 1 BIPOC course (213, 233, 237, 248, 252, 253, 254, 255, 256, 262, 266, 268, 269)
- 3 additional electives at intermediate level

2 Junior seminars [you can take two senior seminars, as long as you have one of each: Jr and Sr]  
(If proposing an Honors Thesis, take 302 Lit Theory Junior year, Winter term)

1 Senior seminar (Honors Thesis requires two additional seminars: 402 & 403)

Please note: The numbers for the 300-level and 400-level courses are reused each year for different topics; so, pay attention to the title of the course, not just the number.

- e.g.:* one term EGL 304 (Jr. Seminar: Fall) might be Medieval Women Warriors;  
the next year EGL 304 (Jr. Seminar: Fall) might be Harlem Renaissance on Display
