The Hudson River Undergraduate Mathematics Conference (HRUMC) is a one-day undergraduate mathematics conference founded in 1994 by faculty from Siena, Skidmore, Union, and Williams Colleges. Since its inception, it has been held annually each spring, hosted by a founding school or another school in the Northeast (e.g., Vassar, Mount Holyoke, Westfield State, Hamilton, St. Lawrence). The conference is typically attended by 300 students and faculty from approximately 50 universities, colleges and community colleges in the Northeastern US. This year,

The goal of the HRUMC is to provide undergraduates with the experience of attending and/or presenting at a professional mathematics meeting. Student and faculty talks are scheduled **together** in sessions that are organized by topic. Some of the 15-minute talks describe original research, while others are expository in nature. The conference also features a keynote address by a noted mathematician. This year's keynote address will be delivered by **Professor Álvaro Lozano-Robledo** from the **University of Connecticut**.
