PRODUCTION DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This term, we decided to pivot from our usual single-production format, where students typically work with one director over several weeks leading up to the show. Instead, we wanted to offer something different—an opportunity for students to work with multiple directors and playwrights on new, original works. The 7 Plays & 7 Days Festival was designed to embrace that diversity, presenting a showcase of fresh perspectives.

Students were fully immersed in a fast-paced process and participated in an 8-day ensemble building boot camp to prepare them for collaboration with each other and working with the new directors and materials. The cast for these productions is not limited to theater majors or minors and brings an exciting mix of Union's student body to the stage. This diversity of backgrounds, beliefs, and viewpoints enriches the experience for everyone involved.

Personally, I believe this festival mirrors the complexity of our society, where we are constantly navigating information from a wide range of sources. The students couldn't cherry-pick their most comfortable scenarios—they had to trust the process, learning what it truly means to work as an ensemble. This experience has given them invaluable tools and skills for their theater practice, while also showing the importance of diving into works that may still be in progress but are no less significant.

I'm thrilled to be one of the directors featured in the 7 Plays & 7 Days Festival, and I look forward to seeing not only my own work come to life but also the incredible work of all.



On stage, Hettie has over 20 years of professional experience, including Broadway roles in Spider-Man: Turn Off the Dark, FELA! (original cast), and Leap of Faith (original cast), alongside performances with Second City Chicago and Urban Bush Women. Her directorial works include Handle With Care, Conversations Embodied, Woke-Ness In The Body & Freedom Dance Floors, and Skin/ Disordered for Create A Space NOW. Hettie has presented her insights on art and activism widely, including with MLK Saratoga and One Billion Rising.
